Tips to identify a census worker in your community

All census workers will have a census ID.

You can verify the ID of a census worker online at: www.census.gov/cgi-bin/main/email.cgi

A census worker will **NEVER**:

- Contact you by email
- Ask you to step outside your home
- Ask you for your Social Security number
- Ask you for money, donations, or credit card information

In March 2020, every mailing address in the United States will receive a letter from the U.S. Census requesting that you provide the following information:

- How many people are living in your home on April 1, 2020
- Whether your home is owned or rented
- Gender, race, age, ethnic group, and relationship status

Every person in the U.S., both citizens and non-citizens, is required by law to fill out the 2020 Census form, which you can do using a mailed-in form, the U.S. Census webpage, or phoning the Census Bureau. **You will not be asked if you are a U.S. citizen.**
